Title: The Definition and Division of Divine Filiation in the Writings of St. Thomas Aquinas **Abstract:** The concept of Divine Filiation applies not only to the adoptive filiation that St. Paul speaks about, and that has been so often written about through the ages since. In fact, St. Thomas outlines five ways in which God is called Father in Sacred Scripture. This thesis traces the relationships between these fives modes of God's fatherhood, defining each in turn. What we find in the end is the whole of creation subsumed into the inner life of the Trinity through the Son, with the preparation for the Incarnation of Christ and our adoptive sonship seminally present at every level.

DISSERTATION IN PHILOSOPHY

Title: Understanding St. Thomas on Analogy

Abstract: The analogy of names is not one of those topics that is important because it is a grand conclusion to intensive philosophical or theological research. Rather, analogy is important because it stands, explicitly or implicitly, at the very beginning of all work in philosophy and theology. For centuries, the thoughts of St. Thomas on analogy, which are found in texts scattered throughout his works, were considered to have been aptly grouped and articulated by Cardinal Cajetan. Most works on analogy in Aquinas since the time of Cajetan merely repeat what Cajetan said. This book approaches the question afresh, returning to the works of St. Thomas in order to find what he thought was the fundamental meaning of the word 'analogy.' Not only are several misconceptions about analogy cleared up, but a description is given of the way that God is first in our thoughts, as well as in reality.
