DISSERTATION

Corpus Christi. Biblische Vorausbilder, sakramentale Vergegenwärtigung und ekklesiologische Vorwegnahme des 'neuen Menschen'

Abstract: The theological key term *Corpus Christi* has three apparently dissimilar, yet tightly connected significations, which constitute the three parts of this work: (1) the physical body of Jesus the Messiah of Israel (*Corpus Christi historicum*), considered in the light of three of his Old Testament types, (2) the Eucharist (*Corpus Christi sacramentale*, or *Corpus verum*), whose major aspects are anticipated in three “feasts of the Lord”, and (3) the Church (*Corpus Christi mysticum*), depicted in the New Testament as Christ’s body, sanctuary and bride. The thesis explores the relationship of these three meanings of the expression “Body of Christ”, which can strengthen our conscience of the inseparability of Christ and his Church and deepen our understanding of the bond between the Churches sacraments, in particular marriage and the Eucharist. The focus on biblical, “pre-dogmatic” terms and metaphors, while confirming the teaching of the Church’s magisterium on these themes, may help to make it comprehensible also for non-catholic Christians and Jewish believers.
